4 First Aid Measures

- **Description of first aid measures**
- **General information:**
Symptoms of poisoning may even occur after several hours; therefore medical observation for at least 48 hours after the accident.
- **After inhalation:**
Remove to fresh air. In case of unconsciousness place patient stably in side position for transportation.
- **After skin contact:**
Immediately wash with water and soap and rinse thoroughly. Remove contaminated clothing. Flush affected areas with plenty of water and soap.
- **After eye contact:**
Rinse opened eye for several minutes under running water. If symptoms persist, consult a doctor.
- **After swallowing:**
Call for a doctor immediately. Do not induce vomiting. Rinse mouth with water (only if person is conscious).
- **Information for doctor:**
Treatment would be supportive, as there is no specific antidote. Contains potassium hydroxide
- **Most important symptoms and effects, both acute and delayed** No further relevant information available.

5 Fire Fighting Measures

- **Suitable extinguishing agents:**

If liquid boils dry, salts in fire will produce harmful gasses.

6 Accidental Release Measures

Wear protective gear. Do not inhale the material or its combustion products. Go against the wind and keep out of low areas. Evacuate personnel to safe area.

Prevent from spreading (e.g. by damming-in or oil barriers).
Do not allow to enter sewers/ surface or ground water. Should not be released into the environment.

For small spills: Dike and absorb spill with sand or inert material (e.g. sawdust). Shovel into drums for disposal. Flush area with water. Note the floor will be slippery. For large spills: Contain liquid far ahead of spill. Contain spillage and contaminated water for subsequent disposal. Do not flush spilled material into drains. Keep spectators away.
